# **PACIFICA COMPLIANCE**

At the end of May, Pacifica national imposed a multilayered mandatory compliance policy to be adhered to by all network Programmers and staff as it pertains to how we talk about things on air within and without the context of a pledge drives, and how we deal with sponsorships/underwriting. Most of our Programmers completed the training. There will be a few more training dates in August to accommodate the few that did not yet complete the program.

### **AUDIPORT**

We are in the process of compiling a list of WPFW programs to place on Audioport for Pacifica sister stations and affiliates to take. Been in discussion with Ursula Rudenberg who administers our Affiliates Program and Audioport about this.

# **NEW PROGRAMS:**

We had several slots to fill between the loss of Programmers due to family responsibilities, death and illness or programs not being consistently delivered or available.

### Berimbau, hosted by Roberto dos Santos (Sundays, 8-10pm, replacing Daniel del Pielago):

A program exploring the rich sounds of Brazilian music, from samba to bossa nova, and beyond. Includes interviews with artists, music reviews and more.

# *Music Memories*, hosted by Alvin Nedab (Sundays, 2-5am, replacing Arthur McLoud who moved to Saturdays, 5-7am)

Presenting the best in old school from the 50s, 60s, & 70s. Alvin Nedab was a former Programmer with Andrea Bray.

# *Equal Portions*, hosted by Seychelle xRichardson (Mondays, 1-2pm; replacing Covert Action Bulletin, which became consistently unavailable over the last few months)

This program explores the problems the DMV community faces in relation to food justice, including food insecurity and food deserts, while also spotlighting the DMV food scene bringing positive attention to the people, restaurants and places within the DMV area making a difference. It also features music by young artists throughout the region. Seychelle is a young woman passionate about brining youn people to WPFW.

# Expansions, hosted by Vince Brown (Tuesdays, 2-5am, replacing Miles Willis who moved to Larry Appelbaum's slot))

A weekly show hosted by veteran broadcaster Vince Brown. It features dance music from around the world, including funk, disco, rock, and world music from 70's-90's. It also includes Jazz, both funky and straight ahead, in the last hour.

# *Full Spectrum*, hosted by Anthony Rogers-Wright (Tuesdays, 6-7pm, replacing Andy Shallal's program)

A 360 degrees analysis and discussion of domestic and global politics. Full Spectrum also features the segment, "Burn Notice," which offers listeners a rare and seldom take on the climate crisis from an unapologetically Black lens and perspective. The program will include commentary from the host and interviews with subject experts from around the country and world. Anthony is a member of Black Alliance for Peace and a racial and environmental justice activist.

# *Unionism Drives Community*, hosted by Renee Bowser (Thursdays, 5-6pm, replacing Extinction Rebellion and Economic Update)

Longtime Trade Unionist discusses the importance of knowing your rights in the workplace; the impact of unionism on working class advancement beyond the workplace, and how unionism can activate robust community among all of us.

Spirits Free Radio, hosted by DJ M (aka Miguel Garcia) (Thursdays, 2-5am, replacing Mojugba Radio)

DJ M, presents a variety of Jazz music from free and spiritual to cool and smooth, to groovy and funky! (thanks to Craig Hall for training him)

New Economic program, hosted by Jon Jeter. We are in discussions about this. Hope to confirm next week.

### **HD CHANNELS**

Staff has begun discussing how to populate the HD Channels. We've concluded that it makes the most sense to populate with syndicated/pre-produced FREE material, so we will be including Covert Action Bulletin, Extinction Rebellion, Economic Update, Electronic Intifad, and more there on the public affairs stream. Having a music stream is more challenging because of the additional cost associated with licensing via Soundexchange, which collects royalties for streamed music. Hosts/contacts for all aforementioned programs have been contacted.

# **RETURN OF TWO WEEKLY CALENDARS**

We are working on the return of our Jazz and Social Justice calendars. WPFW's Jazz Calendar will be produced in partnership with Capitol Bop. Our Social Justice Calendar returns thanks to a grant from the Diverse City Fund to provide funding for Netfa Freeman to train an intern to produce the calendar; an intern has already been identified Thanks to Baba Ayize and Stephanie Wells for securing this grant. We are targeting September to rollout both calendars.

### AUGUST/SEPTEMBER SPECIAL PROGRAMMING

### AUGUST 29 - Free Them All: A Black August Commemoration

Mumia Abu-Jamal reminds us that August is a month of meeting of repression, of radical resistance, of injustice and divine justice, of righteous rebellion, of individual and collective efforts to free the slaves and break the chains that bind us." On August 29<sup>th</sup>, from 1 until 7pm, through both public affairs, and music, WPFW reflects on the heroic African people who fought against all forms of injustice against people of color, the origins of Black August, and honor the lives and legacies of Jonathan and George Jackson, and other Black freedom fighters, as we recommit to the sovereignty and resilience of Black people around the world.

SEPTEMBER 2 – The Grind: Work, Resistance and Hip Hop!

This Labor Day, September 2, WPFW centers programming celebrating workers with *The Grind: Work, Resistance and HipHop*. From 9am until 1pm, we'll hear from workers about conditions, organizing, and resistance, as well as present our annual survey of labor music. At 1pm, our Decipher collective takes over until midnight with Hip Hop reflecting the highs, lows and mid-ranges of the daily grind!

The Committee meets every Wednesday of the month, except for the 2<sup>nd</sup> Wednesday, at 7:30pm via Zoom.

At the August 7<sup>th</sup> meeting, Committee members determined that a summary of the progress made to date should be submitted to the Local Station Board.

### **Summary**

The Relocation Committee met Wednesday, August 7 t 7:30 pm on Zoom. All 10 members attended.

Previously the Genau Group had vetted a list of properties developed by the committee and produced four recommended properties, including one chosen by them. The committee had asked the brokers to obtain nonbinding letters of intent (LOI) for these four properties (all of which, by the time of the meeting, had been cleared for operation by the Chief Engineer).

One property in Takoma Park, declined to provide the LOI because of concerns over Pacifica's financial profile.

One property in Northwest Washington was determined by the committee to be inappropriate because of the time it would take for a build-out.

One property in Silver Spring remains under consideration. The committee asked the broker to request an updated LOI and provide financial information to the landlord.

The fourth property, in Northwest Washington, produced robust discussion and was strongly endorsed by the Chief Engineer and the Interim General Manager. The committee agreed to have Pacifica management sign off on the LOI and will meet on Thursday August 15 to vote on whether to direct the broker to ask for a lease. **Conclusion** 

The Committee will meet on Thursday August 15th at 6PM via Zoom. Meetings will continue as

regularly scheduled on August 21st, 28th and September 4th beginning at 7:30Pm via Zoom 1

### Agenda:

1. Committee Communication and Coordination with Station Staff

The Committee continues to work toward transparency and open communication with WPFW Staff and Designees to conduct its work. There continues to be a lack of communication and coordination concerning Legacy events.

**Follow Up**: The Committee will: 1) Continue to update the Event Coordinator concerning Committee events and dates. 2) Committee Leads will copy the WPFW events Coordinator on significant emails; 3) The Committee will set up a separate meeting with the Event Coordinator based on her schedule to discuss; 4) In order to continue the success of Legacy events, the Committee will continue with its normal process in planning and holding events. This includes adherence to the guidelines for functions that have already been approved.

### 2. Newsletter Update

The Candidate Forum took place at the time of the meeting and Arthur and other candidates were at that meeting. Arthur advised that Vinnie has a programmer in mind to interview for the next newsletter.

**Follow up:** Arthur anticipates getting started on the next edition next week.

#### 3. Blues Festival

Ms. Turner, Sabooh, Minerva and others have been organizing the Festival and working with the Event Coordinator. There was some confusion about ticket sales and collection, but an understanding was achieved. Advertising started last week. It is anticipated that there will be four groups.

**Follow up:** 1) Advertising and tickets sales will take place through Eventbrite; 2) Participants will continue to be able to attend the Festival and pay at the door. Sataria and others will assist with bookkeeping. 3) Money to pay for four groups is needed.

### 4. 5k Run/Walk

Martha is the lead/liaison for this event. Martha thanked committee members for making the edits on the letters that were circulated. The price for the boat ride is \$75.00. There will be no scavenger hunt. The instructors for the wellness classes are set. Classes so far are Tai Chi, Yoga, and Jump Rope. Mariah shared information on a possible grant for the event.

**Follow Up:** 1) Committee Members are to let Martha know of any events that will draw more people to the 5k run/walk. 2) There will be more investigation to determine if there are people interested in running in the afternoon. 3) The Committee will try to secure a dance class. Possibly hand dancing or line dancing. 4) Mariah will make a google form. 5) Martha will investigate getting a time clock, which will save money. 6) Advertising for the event should begin. The Committee will request to have PSAs aired and to have the event posted on the WPFW website. 6) Further investigation into whether we can get a grant to help subsidize this event will take place. 5) Mariah will make a google form.

#### 5. Townhall Meeting

The committee decided to plan our second Townhall meeting for September 28, 2024, and it is to be held at the same church. Violetta emailed the events coordinator and copied the LSB Chair and the Interim Station Manager. To date, there has been no reply to the email.

Additionally, a notice for a July Townhall meeting was posted on the website and later disappeared. It appears that no one knows anything about it.

**Follow Up:** Violetta will follow up to make sure that the date is okay.

### 6. Youth Brigade

Mariah reported that she and Jordan, Fred, and Paul met. It was decided that the immediate focus would be on making the WPFW website more user friendly. They met with Otis about an upgrade. Otis stated that an update was already planned. The donation page needs to be updated because it is convoluted, and the link is hard to share.
